This workshop will explore ways to guide children's behaviour in a positive way. The educators will learn about self-regulation, reflective behaviour and relationship building. We will also discuss the underlying factors that affect children's emotional health and cause behaviour issues. We will talk about creating a child centered curriculum and environment to manage these issues. We will also discuss effective conflict resolution.

Identifying and providing effective early support to children is one of the roles of early childhood educators. This workshop will discuss what developmental delay/disorders are, help identify early warning signs, provide strategies for success as well as for developing effective working relationships with parents. It will also include ideas on making connections and building strong relationships with other community services and childcare programs available for families.

Presenter: Malgosia Tomanik, M.Ed., is a Family Consultant who specializes in supporting children from preschool to high school age and their parents/caregivers in a variety of environments, including homes, school, and childcare settings. Whether you refer to it as Responsive, Emergent Curriculum or Inquiry Based Learning, join us to discover how authentic inquiry has potential to evolve into a long term projects.

Our image of the child aligns with one of the underlying principles of Reggio Emilia, in which we see the child as 'rich in potential, strong, powerful, competent, and most of all connected to adults and other children' (Malaguzzi, 1993, p. 10). Educators work alongside the children and their natural curiosity to observe and develop in-depth investigations that reflect and are built upon authentic interests of the children, making their preschool experience fun, exciting and relevant to them and their world. Educators extend and expand these interests to create deep, meaningful learning opportunities which lay the foundation for future learning. Both Sue and Caren are recipients of the Prime Minister's Award of Excellence in Early Childhood Education, in 2012 and 2017 respectively.

ALERT EMERGENCY CHILDCARE FIRST AID CPR/AED - LEVEL C

This fun and interactive 8 hour course trains people how to react and improvise when dealing with life threatening emergencies. This course includes initial assessment, disease prevention, secondary survey, airway obstruction, adult, child and infant CPR and AED (level C). Recognition and first-aid treatment for head and spine injuries, shock, burns, bleeding, seizures, broken bones, anaphylactic shock, small wound management, poisoning, heat exhaustion and heat stroke will also be addressed. Participants spend the majority of the course doing hands on first-aid and participating in first-aid scenarios. By practicing with scenarios students gain confidence, learn to improvise, and react in emergency situations. This course meets Child Licensing guidelines.


