SPARKING SELF-REFLECTION THROUGH EXPLORING FAMILY SYSTEMS

The intention of this workshop is to introduce a systems perspective on the complex emotional functioning of families by exploring the Bowen Family Systems (BFS) theory, a leading family therapy theory, and to increase awareness of how our own experiences may impact our work. Families have the most important role and influence on their children's well-being and learning. Participants will be introduced to the concepts of families as an emotional unit, emotional systems, anxiety binding behaviors families can fall into to manage emotions, how these patterns can affect family systems and the individuals in them along with much more. In the Early Learning field we are constantly engaging in family systems, an awareness of how family systems may be functioning emotionally can help us be more intentional in our work. All concepts in BFS theory apply to non-family groups such as work and social groups. This workshop will provide opportunities for both self-reflection and active engagement. Although this workshop introduces a therapeutic theory it is meant for awareness only and is not meant to provide a therapeutic experience.

Presenter: Michelle Milne has 20 years as an ECE and has taught her to highly value knowledge acquired through a combination of lived experience and education. She has trained in the Bowen Family Systems Theory and The Principles of Collective Trauma Healing along with training as a facilitator for Roots of Empathy, MAPS & PATHS, and Non-violent Crisis Intervention. She looks forward to learning from participants' lived experiences.

Would you like to learn more about Inquiry Based Learning? In this workshop we will take a deep dive into projects that were ignited by the curiosities of preschoolers which became long term investigations and projects. Whether you refer to it as Responsive or Emergent Curriculum or Inquiry Based Learning, join us to discover how observing an ordinary moment has potential to evolve into a long term project. Goal: Demonstrate the multiple ways children learn when their inquiries are sparked from their authentic interests.

Presenter: Sue Woodward and Caren Eigenmann are co-teachers and the co-owners of Childgarden Preschool & Discoveries in Port Moody, BC, which opened in 2007. Our image of the child aligns with one of the underlying principles of Reggio Emilia, in which we see the child as 'rich in potential, strong, powerful, competent, and most of all connected to adults and other children' (Malaguzzi, 1993, p. 10). Educators work alongside the children and their natural curiosity to observe and develop in-depth investigations that reflect and are built upon authentic interests of the children, making their preschool experience fun, exciting and relevant to them and their learning. Educators extend and expand these interests to create deep, meaningful learning opportunities which lay the foundation for future learning. Both Sue and Caren are recipients of the Prime Minister's Award of Excellence in Early Childhood Education, in 2012 and 2017 respectively.

CONNECTING WITH CHILDREN TO RE-ROUTE DIFFICULT BEHAVIORS

This workshop draws from interpersonal neurobiology, Emotion Coaching, and Teacher-Child Interaction Therapy treatments that are aimed at addressing disruptive behaviour in children. You will learn how to connect with children in a way that fosters deeper understanding, enhances emotion regulation, and creates better cooperation. The reasons behind children's behaviour come from a number of sources, but the ways to address them are simple and logical if they are applied with consistency and predictability. We will focus on positive discipline strategies, including how to pay more attention to children when they are behaving well, than when they are not.

Presenter: Kate Saunders has over 20 years of experience as a counsellor and educator, specializing in working with children and families. Kate is a Registered Clinical Counsellor in BC. She works therapeutically with children in play therapy, with parents/adults, and with parents and children together to address challenging behaviours and emotion regulation. Kate is a sought-after presenter for the practical and effective strategies she offers, as well as her lively presentation style. She focuses particularly on supporting healthy attachment and emotional development with all of her clients.

REGGIO BEYOND PINTEREST: CREATING A PERSONAL PEDAGOGY

This workshop empowers educators to take ownership in their practice and recognize the underlying theories that uphold their actions. After a brief introduction to the Reggio Emilia Approach, we look closely at the idea of "The Image of the Child" as a framework for our own values-based pedagogy. We practice looking beyond the aesthetics to identify drivers behind pedagogical choices. Participants are guided through a social constructivist, Reggio- inspired framework of critical thinking, collaboration, and creativity to discover more about their own guiding principles. We consider action steps participants can take to closer align their practice with their beliefs. Participants will leave feeling confident, clear in their purpose, and inspired with new ideas.

Presenter: Karen Begley supports and empowers educators to feel fantastic about the work they are already doing by making connections between their underlying values, everyday programming, and pedagogical theory. Her playful style makes for interactive workshops that generate new ideas and increase participants' confidence and competency to bring practical and enriching experiences to the children in their care.

AUTISM STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex condition that impacts brain development and affects a person's social relationships, communication, interests, and behavior. Caregivers play a very important role in the detection of developmental concerns, early diagnosis and targeted supports. They may be the first people to notice any developmental challenges. Although sharing concerns about a child's development is a very emotional experience for parents, it is of utmost important to communicate it with them in a professional and supportive way. This workshop will provide ECE with information on Autism, how to identify early warning signs, and how to successfully support children with ASD and their parents.

Presenter: Malgosia Tomanik, M.Ed., is a Family Consultant who specializes in supporting children from preschool to high school age and their parents/caregivers in a variety of environments, including homes, school, and childcare settings. Malgosia is experienced in addressing concerns associated with the daily challenges of caring for a child/youth who requires support, helping to make sense of difficult behavior and supporting adults for each child in finding a way through.
