SETTING THE STAGE FOR RESPONSIVE CURRICULUM (PART 1)

Early Childhood Educators extend the child's thinking and learning by asking questions, making suggestions and providing materials and assistance as needed to enable a child to consolidate learning. "Curriculum" conveys that there is teacher planning in such settings, and "responsive" reminds us that the children's needs, interests and spontaneity always have a place where young children play and learn.

During day one of this two-day training we will explore responsive and engaging group/circle/gathering times as well as webbing children's interests with them.

During day two we will have hands-on work taking what we've learned and worked on the prior week, to create a workable document for responsive curriculum planning and looking at how our environment supports this planning. Suitable for early learning child care professionals working with children of verbal age.

***Must attend both days of training.**

Presenter: Kristi Schwandt studied Fine Arts, and had a multitude of careers before finding the Early Childhood Education profession. She learned responsive curriculum inspired by Reggio Emilia and since, she has never looked back. Recently she has been an ECE Facilitator for the City of Surrey providing training and support for preschool instructors. Currently she is designing and remodeling City of Surrey preschool environments.

AUTISM and the EVOLUTION of CONSCIOUSNESS

Neurology is never written in stone, and we shape the way we use our brain through the activities and patterns that we engage in and practice. We create ourselves through our preferences and our actions, creating the person we are. Many of us do this subconsciously, and as such we are products of what we are exposed to. We should learn to understand, accept, and work with our stress response systems, as we do with people with autism and regulatory disorders. We should understand our own triggers, as well as tools that work for us. We should also understand that our emotions are largely shaped by our reinterpretation of the present in light of past traumas. We will learn about the important foundations of developmental maturity, and how we are affected through life by these issues. You will also learn how small changes in how you communicate can begin to bring about a change in your own consciousness. We will talk about sensory activities to dissipate stress, balance hormones, build resilience, and make better decisions.

Presenter: Mark Landry has worked as an occupational therapist for over 30 years. He has a private practice in and around Vancouver, where he provides OT services, workshops, and consultation. Mark most recently worked for Vancouver Coastal Health providing Occupational Therapy for children in Vancouver schools. Mark trained and worked in Connecticut for 13 years before relocating to Vancouver. Mark has always worked with children, in a variety of settings including public schools, preschools, families' homes, daycares, and institutions. Much of this experience is with children with autism and sensory processing disorders. Mark has also worked to educate OT's, parents, caregivers, and other professionals.

RESPONSIBLE ADULT COURSE

SPRING 2017

Description:

This course was developed to meet the requirements for 20 hours of training for "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by the Child Care Regulation. Through interactive sessions, it covers basic concepts about child development from birth to 12 years of age, child guidance, health, safety and nutrition and programming. Participants must be at least 19 years old to register, attend all sessions and pass all open book quizzes with a satisfactory mark in order to receive a certificate of completion. The workbook is included in the course fee. This is a non-credit course (cannot be applied towards the completion of a degree).

This course meets the requirements for 20 hours of training for "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by the Child Care Regulation to qualify for employment in family child care or school age child care settings.

MAKING SENSE OF ATTENTION PROBLEMS

Attention and agitation issues are increasing at alarming rates among our children and youth. Such restlessness can pose challenges for learning and behaviour at home and school. Adults often feel overwhelmed and confused about how to make headway with a child who cannot seem to focus or sit still. In trying to alleviate symptoms we can unknowingly employ measures that are serving to exacerbate their attention problem. There is much that can be done to help bring a child to rest by understanding the two common roots of attention problems.

Presenter: Dr. Deborah MacNamara is a counsellor with a private practice in Vancouver and is on faculty at the Neufeld Institute. She works with parents, educators, child-care and mental health professionals in making sense of kids from the inside out. She is the author of the recently released *'Rest, Play, Grow: Making Sense of Preschoolers (Or Anyone Who Acts Like One)*.

SELF-REGULATION OF YOUNG CHILDREN THROUGH SOMATIC BASED LEARNING: LET'S MOVE TOGETHER!

Sensory-motor development in the first years of life sets the foundation for healthy brain-body growth. Using movement-based intervention can assist in addressing disabilities or delays. The developmental movement cycle aids in a child's ability to focus, pay attention, recuperate and modulate emotionally. Ongoing physical literacy and interpersonal skills allows them to be successful learners.

In this interactive and experiential seminar, participants will discover ways to support self-regulation in children ages 1 – 5 through an understanding of:

- Neuro-motor movement patterns and their connection to learning
- The self-satisfaction action sequence
- Simple, fast and fun movement-based activities

Presenter: Marcia F. W. Jones, BSc., MSc. Marcia is a Certified Movement Analyst (CMA) and Developmental Movement Educator and founder of Inner Dancer – Creative Movement and Dance. She holds a professional certificate in Integrative Body Psychology (IBP) and has trained extensively in other movement therapy practices. She specializes in using movement to enhance early childhood development. She has over 16 years of being inspired by the practice of Gabrielle Roth's 5Rhythms® and is a Certified 5Rhythms® Teacher. She uses the tools of Laban Movement Analysis (LMA), the Bartenieff Fundamentals™, Body Mind Centering (BMC), Brain Compatible Dance Education and other somatic healing practices and expressive arts therapies in her private practice and groups.

RISK TAKING IN PLAY: IT'S TOO DANGEROUS NOT TOO

Drawing on the latest play-work research and practice from around the world, this interactive workshop will cover the role of physical and emotional risk-taking in child-directed free play. Participants will critically reflect upon the impact our risk-averse society has on these opportunities, including a self-assessment of personal comfort levels. Using risk-benefit assessments, participants will take practical steps to identify where and how children in their care can test their physical and emotional limits, while reducing the likelihood or severity of harm.

Presenter: Sophie Cooper is an education consultant and play-work trainer from the UK currently living in North Vancouver. Sophie started in the play-work profession over 20 years ago as a play ranger. She has been delivering professional workshops and training courses on child-directed free play for 15 years including the ground-breaking 'Play-work: Principles into Practice' or 'P3' course for Play Wales, and currently tutors on Pop-Up Adventure Play's on-line international Play-work Development in Youth and Community Work. Sophie works to build capacity for rights-respecting, participatory and playful ways of working with children and youth.

EMERGENCY CHILD CARE FIRST AID/CPR LEVEL B

This 8.5 hour course includes obstructed airway procedures, breathing emergencies and CPR for babies, children and youth. The course also includes basic first aid for common injuries such as bleeding, burns, falls, fractures, poisons and some medical conditions etc. There also is a section on child safety.

The Emergency Child Care First Aid course is recommended for child care workers and anyone living with children. This course also includes certification in Automated External Defibrillation (AED) use.
