IS TIME-OUT OUTDATED?

Time-out or time-away is often used as a means to discipline children in child care. It is important to refine the understanding of this technique and propose alternative ways of not only guiding the behavior but also to

focus on understanding the triggers and elements that cause it. Understanding the context of behavior will present educators with an alternative approach to guidance and at the same time offer the child an array of problem solving skills, including the ability to self-regulate over time. Even though sometimes to sit in solitude for a few moments is all a child needs to switch gears, labeling it as *time-out* will tend to impose "self-control". This lacks key understanding of behavior challenges, rather than an opportunity to learn how to cope with frustration and modify undesired behavior.

Presenter: Ana Vojnovic is an educator, artist and designer. Her pedagogical and creative practices are an integrated interdisciplinary response to basic questions of how built/designed environments affect and condition human perception, communication, learning, and socialization.

EMERGENCY CHILD CARE FIRST AID/CPR LEVEL B

This 8-hour course includes obstructed airway procedures, breathing emergencies and CPR for babies, children and youth. The course also includes basic first aid for common injuries such as bleeding, burns, falls, fractures, poisons and some medical conditions etc. There is also a section on child safety.

The Emergency Child Care First Aid course is recommended for child care workers and anyone living with children. This course also includes certification in Automated External Defibrillation (AED) use.

20 HOUR RESPONSIBLE ADULT COURSE

This course was developed to meet the requirements for 20 hours of training for "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by Child Care Licensing Regulation. Through interactive sessions, it covers basic concepts about child development from birth to 12 years of age, child guidance, health, safety, nutrition and programming. Participants must be at least 19 years old to register, attend all sessions, and pass all open book quizzes with a satisfactory mark in order to receive a certificate of completion. The workbook is included in the course fee. This is a non-credit course (cannot be applied towards the completion of a degree).

Presenter: Sharon Crowley is an instructor of Early Childhood Education with Delta Continuing Education. She teaches Early Childhood courses as well as coordinates the Delta ECE Diploma program. Sharon is a mother and grandmother with a passion for working with children and families.

IDENTIFYING AND PREVENTING BULLY CULTURE IN SCHOOL AGE SETTINGS

This 3-hour workshop is designed for educators working with children ages 3 to 12. Participants learn how bully culture develops and how with intentional programming, space for bullying can be reduced by using specific tools, techniques and strategies such as: The British Columbia Early Learning Framework, Safe Spaces in School Age Care (Bully-prevention for pre-school and school aged children) and Zones of Regulation.

Presenter: Tyler Summers ECE, SACCC, has been working in School Age Care for two decades and is currently the Executive Director at Jericho Kids Club Child Care Society and a member of the School Age Child Care Association of British Columbia. He also serves as Chair of the Vancouver Community College Early Child Care and Education Program Advisory Committee and is a session instructor for the ECCE program at VCC. LEARNING FROM THE HIGHLY SENSITIVE CHILD

In this presentation, April will speak about Highly Sensitive Children (HSC): how to identify them; how to capitalize on the special qualities that HSC possess such as keen senses, high empathy and intuition; how these qualities are actually needed for resilience; and the areas in which these qualities can be encouraged and valued within group processes (based on the research of Elaine Eron and Dr. Kimberly Schonert-Reichl). She will also give practical ideas and solutions for programming when working with HSC in early childhood, child care and school-age settings.

Presenter: April Martin-Ko's work has involved diverse children and families for over 20 years. She is the Provincial Coordinator for the Parent-Child Mother Goose Program® in BC. She also studies Play Therapy and is using these techniques one-on-one with children on the Autism Spectrum. She holds a Bachelor of Education and is continuing her studies towards a Masters of Education in Early Childhood Education at UBC, focusing on Social/Emotional Development. April is passionate about the power of storytelling and believes cultivating imagination fosters resilience in children and families.

WHEN YOUNG CHILDREN ERUPT: HELPING YOURSELF STAY STEADY IN TOUGH SITUATIONS

Some days you have to deal with a child or their parent who lashes out. Often you can see it brewing and you want to step in early. You also notice it's hard on you. Maybe your stomach begins to churn or your neck or jaw tightens. Your workplace has a specific protocol. You know what you're supposed to do and telling yourself to breathe before stepping in just isn't enough to ease the tension inside. Automatic physical reactions need physical strategies. This experiential workshop draws on the concepts of interactive neurobiology and self-regulation to teach you practical techniques to use in these difficult moments. Objectives: Practice picking up earlier signs that a child is about to erupt. Learn physical strategies you can use right in the moment to ease the tension you feel. Explore and practice methods to support yourself so you can act more calmly and effectively.

Presenter: Shayna Hornstein is an adult educator, body-focused counsellor and registered physical therapist. Her organizational development work improves resilience and workplace communication. In her clinical practice she helps people lessen the impact that stress has on their bodies. She especially enjoys supporting frontline child care educators and caregivers, for they do critical work that builds healthy communities.

PINK AND BLUE: THE DEVELOPMENT OF GENDER IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

But how much of gender is nurture rather than nature? Are girls naturally sugar and spice and everything nice, is there genetically a reason why "boys will be boys"? How do outside factors like gender stereotypes, social influences, culture and biases have an influence on how children develop their understanding of gender? This workshop will examine the development of a child understanding gender in early childhood, how even unconscious gender biases can hinder a child meeting their potential and how to support gender equality in the early years.
