CURRICULUM DESIGN

What is curriculum and how do we, as educators, understand it and approach it in our daily practice? The question of why in Early Childhood practice is prevalent and crucial, and the why of the curriculum, as an integral part of that same practice, is a necessary one. Practice that is examined on an ongoing basis is the key to the quality of not only education but living itself. In this workshop, Ana will present both the principles and elements of curriculum design and what needs to be considered when we think about it in the context of our practice.

Presenter: Ana Vojnovic works as an educator, artist-designer and a lecturer. Her work is an interdisciplinary response to urban conditions, and questions of how built/designed environments affect and condition human perception, and our response to designed circumstances.

RESPONSIBLE ADULT 20 HOUR CHILD CARE COURSE

This course was developed to meet the requirements for 20 hours of training for "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by Child Care Licensing Regulation. Through interactive sessions, it covers basic concepts about child development from birth to 12 years of age, child guidance, health, safety, nutrition and programming. Participants must be at least 19 years old to register, **attend all sessions** (there is not an option to make up missed classes), and pass all open book quizzes with a satisfactory mark in order to receive a certificate of completion. The workbook is included in the course fee. This is a non-credit course (cannot be applied towards the completion of a degree).

Presenter: Sharon Crowley is a mother and a grandmother – she began her career over 30 years ago as an early childhood educator, and continues to be active in the field by teaching adult learners. For the past 6 years, she has taken her passion for literacy into the community, where she has held the position of Literacy Outreach Coordinator in Abbotsford.

RISK TAKING IN PLAY - IT'S TOO DANGEROUS NOT TO!

Risk-taking provides some of life's most thrilling, most empowering, most educational experiences, and is an innate part of children's play. Coming from a play-work perspective this interactive workshop will look at how our risk-averse society has impacted children and childhoods, including our own personal comfort levels. Through group exercises and discussion participants will take practical steps, including using a risk-benefit assessment tool, to identify where and how children in their care can test their physical and emotional limits, while reducing the likelihood or severity of harm.

Presenter: Sophie Cooper started out over 20 years ago as a Play Ranger supporting inclusive play provision in South Wales. She went on to co-develop and deliver a ground-breaking play-work development course for Play Wales: 'Play-work Principles into Practice'. She has since worked internationally supporting child directed free play, she has a Masters' Degree in Community Education and a Post-Graduate Diploma in Youth and

Community Work.

EMERGENCY CHILD CARE FIRST AID/CPR LEVEL B

This 8-hour course includes obstructed airway procedures, breathing emergencies and CPR for babies, children and youth. The course also includes basic first aid for common injuries such as bleeding, burns, falls, fractures, poisons and some medical conditions etc. There is also a section on child safety. The Emergency Child Care First Aid course is recommended for child care workers and anyone living with children. This course also includes certification in Automated External Defibrillation (AED) use.

Instructor: Karen Clark as the owner and operator of The Vital Link, has been teaching Red Cross First Aid and CPR courses for over 20 years. She has taught locally, provincially, nationally and internationally. Karen's background and certification in ECE has made her very sought after in this field.

A DAY WITHOUT "NO"

If you have ever said "No" to a child then you will know that word can seem like an invitation into a meltdown. As adults, we can become frustrated when a child doesn't respond appropriately to our instruction and continue with more "No's". Learning how to balance the importance of boundaries with the reasons why children struggle with the word, "no" is key; the language we use can be significant in the way children behave. Participants will be invited to reflect on how their beliefs about children influence the way they respond to situations and practically consider how to shift from the frustration of "No" and learn positive ways to respond to the children in our care.

Presenter: Alicia Kirlik has been working as an ECE since 2011. A Day Without NO is inspired by a series of events where she challenged herself to only speak affirmingly to children for an entire day - the results changed her work, for the better! Alicia is passionate about inviting adults to see how every moment is an opportunity for children to learn and grow.

FAMILY CENTERED PRACTICE FOR CHILD CARE PROVIDERS

PSYCHOLOGICAL FIRST AID

This two-hour workshop will introduce the principles of the World Health Organisation, (WHO) model for Psychological First Aid (PFA). Participants will have an opportunity to discuss and apply tips and tools for helping people responsibly in the aftermath emergencies, disasters or critical incidents. Developing skills to approach safely, listen and link children and adults in crisis to effective supports and resources are the main objectives of learning PFA. "When terrible things happen, we want to reach out a helping hand to those who have been affected. Psychological First Aid is a humane, supportive and practical response to people suffering exposure to serious stressors and who may need support. It is an approach to help people recover by responding to their basic needs.

Presenter: Carolyn Sinclair is President of Strategic Business Risks International Inc. (SBRI) who deliver investigation, emergency management and educational solutions to public and private organizations and institutions. She has developed and customized personal safety & preparedness training for first responders, school districts and private agency emergency response teams.
