## (A.) GROWING LEADERS

What do children need to be successful in life? Research has found that emotional intelligence (EQ) is four times more likely to predict a persons success than IQ. This two hour workshop will explore what leadership is and how leadership skills can be learned at an early age through connection, emotional intelligence, creativity and opportunities for bravery.

## (B.) GOT GRIT? FOSTERING GROWTH, CHALLENGE, AND PERSEVERANCE IN YOUNG CHILDREN

Grit is defined as "passion and perseverance for very long term goals." 90% of children's social, emotional and cognitive development happens in the first five years of life, what about the development of grit? This workshop will examine the factors that support the development of grit, motivation and resiliency, which are key to helping children thrive and become successful adults. The Got Grit workshop will look at research and practice to engage participants to make an impact and get "gritty" when teaching kids.

**Presenter:** Katelyn Moon has been an Early Childhood Educator since 2008. Her passion is to support children in developing social and emotional skills that will grow with them throughout their lives. In 2015 Katelyn returned to school to further her education in leadership, teaching and child care licensing. Her new education has shaped her views of the importance of teaching leadership to young children.

## MAKING SENSE OF ANXIETY IN KIDS

Anxiety is one of the leading issues among children and teens today. From school to home, anxiety can happen anywhere and can take on many forms from worrying, obsessions, compulsions, phobias and other perplexing behaviours. What is clear is we cannot treat something we do not understand. In this unique presentation, Deborah will provide a fresh perspective on anxiety by weaving together medicine, developmental psychology, neuroscience, attachment research, and cultural tradition. Application to the classroom environment and school setting will be addressed.

**Presenter:** Dr. Deborah MacNamara is the author of the best-selling book Rest, Play, Grow: Making Sense of Preschoolers (or anyone who acts like one) Deborah is on Faculty at the Neufeld Institute, and is the Director of Kid's Best Bet, a Counselling and Family Resource Center. Deborah is a dynamic teacher and experienced counsellor who makes developmental science come to life in the everyday context of home and classroom. She also provides counselling services to parents and professionals to make sense of learning, behavioural, and developmental issues in kids – from babies to teens. Deborah travels nationally and internationally, speaking to child and adolescent development issues to groups including the United Nations and the Dalai Lama Center for Peace and Education. With over 60 presentations a year to groups including parents, educators, child care professionals, social workers, foster and adopt community, and health care professionals, Deborah shares her insight and passion for making sense of kids. She is a developmentalist at heart who is continually fascinated by the mysteries and beauty inherent to human maturation.

## **EMERGENCY CHILD CARE FIRST AID**
