In Person Workshop and Courses COVID - 19 Precautions

What to expect when you arrive:

- Before admittance to class a self-assessment questionnaire will be done with a CCRR staff member.
- All participants/instructors must sanitize their hands upon entry to the building.



Kids Yoga and Mindfulness for Care Providers. Part 1 & 2

Come join us in this exciting two part workshop series offering hands-on activities to easily integrate yoga and mindfulness into your daycare setting, along with specialized programming and instructor support to learn tools, practice implementation, then receive support and feedback.

In Part One you will learn an Introduction to Kids Yoga & Mindfulness, Practices for Self Care for Care Providers and tools for breathing, warm up's and yoga poses. Care Providers will be given easy-to-implement practices to practice with children of all ages. In Part Two you will receive support and guidance based on the tools you have implemented, then learn a variety of Mindfulness Games, Peace Corner ideas, kids yoga and mindfulness resources and tips for leading guided relaxation time.

Children's yoga helps to develop essential tools such as self-regulation, a stronger mind-body connection, and introduces skills that help children to find a sense of inner-calm. These yoga tools are gifts that can transform the lives of the children that receive them. Each participant receives the Harmony Kids Yoga Guide for Care Providers with exercises and applications for daycare use.

Presenter: Jennie Abbot is the founder and director of Harmony Kids Yoga, bringing yoga and mindfulness to over ten thousand children to date, between the ages of 1 to 18 years throughout the lower mainland. Jennie is a Registered Yoga Teacher (CYA-RYT200), Registered Children's Yoga Teacher (CYA-CYT), and is trained in Color Me Yoga for Children, Rainbow Kids Yoga for Children, Trauma Informed Yoga for Children and Youth and offers 95 Hour Registered Yoga Teacher Training through the International Yoga Alliance.

Alert Emergency Childcare First Aid

Supporting Children with Autism: The Inclusive Classroom

Children with autism bring many joys to our classrooms. However, they may require accommodations, modifications, and supports that differ from neurotypical children in order to best experience and share these joys. Often these children receive a support person. However, the children who are waiting for assessment are left struggling without formal supports while educators try their best to fill in the gaps. In cases where there is a support person in place, the divide in knowledge and roles between "the support person" and "the educators" leads to a divide amongst children and care. This workshop will give educators the foundational knowledge of an autism diagnosis, the implications for social emotional learning, and insight how to best support children on the spectrum in an inclusive manner. Topics covered: autism, routines, functions of behaviour, sensory processing, positive language, and AAC.

Presenter: Monica Maddison is a private behaviour consultant with Bloom Behaviour. With 12 years of experience supporting children with autism and their families, she strives for education, advocacy, and inclusion. Monica's support extends from clinic, home, school, and daycare.
