SENSORY PROCESSING


Sensory Processing outlines in detail what it means to be "hypersensitive" and "hyposensitive" in terms of sensory processing, functioning, and regulation. We explore the core causes of these struggles, and how as educators we can best accommodate them within our physical classroom environment. We will cover explicit strategies to determine areas of struggle for children in our care, and create actionable plans with simple strategies to make our space more inclusive.

Presenter: Monica Maddison has served neurodiverse children (and their families) for over a decade. This experience ranges from one to one support, therapy, behaviour consulting, classroom advocacy, and inclusion planning. Monica is a college instructor and speaker - educating adults in how to care for children through a neurodiversity confirming, intentional, and inclusive practice.

POSITIVE APPROACH TO GUIDANCE

This workshop will explore ways to guide children's behaviour in a positive way. The educators will learn about self-regulation, reflective behaviour and relationship building. We will also discuss the underlying factors that affect children's emotional health and cause behaviour issues. We will talk about creating a child centered curriculum and environment to manage these issues. We will also discuss effective conflict resolution.


- disorders of the voice

INTRODUCTION TO EMERGENT CURRICULUM



QUALITY SLEEP IN GROUP CHILD CARE SETTING: I/T FOCUSED



MARKETING YOUR CHILD CARE BUSINESS



WALKING TOGETHER: MEANINGFUL ENGAGEMENT IN TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

Many Canadians are only beginning to learn of Canada's colonial history and its impacts on Indigenous people. How do we work towards Reconciliation? We must begin by recognizing and acknowledging the Truth. We will cover the true history from first contact to present day and explore the impacts it has had on multiple generations through discussions about trauma and its transmission through generations by epigenetics. We will support reflection and understanding of your own social location and relationship with privilege and power. Skills for engaging respectfully with Indigenous clients, families and communities will be explored through understanding historical trauma and key differences in worldview. Experiential exercises will assist you in integrating your learning on mental, emotional, physical and spiritual levels.

Presenter: Katelyn Moon and Karla Joseph are partners in advancing Truth and Reconciliation by engaging all people in open and honest conversations about Canada's colonial past, reconciliation, power and privilege. Karla is of St'át'imc and German decent and is a member of Xwisten/Bridge River Indian Band. Karla has a MSW in Indigenous Trauma and Resiliency from the University of Toronto. Katelyn Moon is a White Settler who has education and experience in ECE and Health Leadership.


