# “AANSAAMB AEN KISKAYHTAAMUK - LEARNING TOGETHER”

“Aansaambaenkiskayhtaamuk - Learning Together”(Heritage Michif, translated by Norman Fleury) is a learning guide with accompanying resources developed by the MNBC Ministry of Education. These resources are intended to support both Métis and non-Métis early learning and child care professionals to integrate Métis content and pedagogy into their work with young children. Our intent is to promote learning environments in which Métis culture is recognized and celebrated.

**Presenter:** Farzaneh Sani has been in Early Childhood Education (ECE) and Infant and Toddler (IT) field for the last 23 years. She earned her ECE and IT certification from Douglas College. Her career began with teaching and supervising ECE students during their practicums at different colleges. For the past five years, Farzaneh worked for North Shore Child Care Resource and Referral (CCRR) team. She helped child care providers, families, and the community in North Shore. She also worked with local Municipalities to assist potential child care providers in opening facilities and answering their questions. Recently, Farzaneh joined MNBC (Métis Nation British Columbia) as a Child Care Coordinator. In her new role, she conducts workshops in the Lower Mainland and helps Métis citizens apply for the MCCB (Métis Child Care Benefit) and support the child care providers enrolled in the program.



This workshop is based on award-winning research from Sheridan College, conducted by the facilitator about Forest School philosophy. In this workshop, educators will also think about different factors impacting ECE's professional practice in implementing the forest school approach. This workshop can be helpful for educators as it will support them with knowledge about the benefits of embracing a Nature-based perspective through real-life examples and discussion. The facilitator is located in ON, Canada.

# THERE'S NO APP FOR THAT

This professional development training focuses on early literacy inspired strategies to help caregivers and professionals manage screen time use – both in their own lives, as well as in the lives of the children around them. Highlights include:

- What neuroscience says about the effects of screen time on brain development in childhood
- The impact of screen time on language and literacy skills development
- Behavioral repercussions of increased screen time exposure – including biologically compelled responses as well as social-emotional and physical development delays
- The importance of adult role modelling in regard to positive screen time use
- Specific strategies and suggestions to effectively manage screen time use in a family literacy context
- Provision of a suggested book list that incorporates screen time themes and encourages discussion of related topics between caregiver and child.
