REGISTRATION POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Training certificates

Training certificates will be issued via email within 5 business days of the workshop attended. To receive a certificate you must arrive on time, participate, stay for the entire session and have your video on (if online). If you have not received your certificate after 5 business days, please call us. If you require a copy of your certificate after 30 days of the workshop you will incur a \$10 reissuing charge.

Late Arrivals

Late arrivals of more than 15 minutes will not be admitted to the workshop.

Registration/Payment

Prepayment is required for all workshops.

This course includes initial assessment, disease prevention, secondary survey, airway obstruction, adult, child and infant CPR and AED (level C). Recognition and first-aid treatment for head and spine injuries, shock, burns, bleeding, seizures, broken bones, anaphylactic shock, small wound management, poisoning, heat exhaustion and heat stroke will also be addressed. Participants spend the majority of the course doing hands on first-aid and participating in first-aid scenarios. By practicing with scenarios students gain confidence, learn to improvise, and react in emergency situations. This course meets Child Licensing guidelines.



LET THEM FALL DOWN: WHY RISKY PLAY IS VITAL TO CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

Learn why risky play is vital to childhood development in this 2 hour workshop. This workshop is for everyone who may be curious (and a bit uncomfortable) with risky play to those who are very comfortable with it. Let Them Fall Down is an opportunity to push personal boundaries while learning about evidence based studies supporting risky play and how it can affect children's development. TRYING DIFFERENTLY: A RELATIONSHIP APPROACH TO CHALLENGING BEHAVIORS

Most parenting and professional approaches to challenging behaviors do not recognize brain development and the power of relationships. Instead, interventions often target presenting behaviors for change. Trying differently means to expand our range of options and move from punishing behaviors to understanding them, and to changing the environment and our expectations of the children/youth. This workshop is designed to help professionals and parents shift from changing the child's behavior to reframing perceptions, changing the way they respond to the behavior and developing appropriate and effective support strategies. We will also explore the key role of relationship in addressing challenging behavior.

Presenter: Malgosia Tomanik, M.Ed., is a Family Consultant who specializes in supporting children from preschool to high school age and their parents/caregivers in a variety of environments, including homes, school, and childcare settings. Malgosia is experienced in addressing concerns associated with the daily challenges of caring for a child/youth who requires support, helping to make sense of difficult behavior and supporting the big people for each child in finding a way through.

Malgosia also works as an FASD Key Worker with the Fraser Valley Child Development Centre and in British Columbia, Canada. In her role as a Key Worker, she provides support to parents/caregivers raising children and youth who are living with FASD and other neurobehavioral conditions.

Developing life long self regulation skills through breathwork and mindful movement. In today's fast paced world, children face stressors that can overwhelm their ability to self-regulate. The peaceful play game, provides young learners with the tools they need to foster inner peace, manage emotions, and cultivate mindfulness - skills that last a life time.
